Description of Class:

William Golding's 1954 novel, *Lord of the Flies*, tells the story of a group of young boys who find themselves alone on a deserted island. They develop rules and a system of organization, but without any adults to serve as a civilizing impulse, the children eventually become violent and brutal. We will learn together through the use of engaging literature, class discussion, comprehension activities, and videos. Learning new vocabulary words will be a focus of this course, as will literary analysis.

The class will be a combination of reading comprehension, journal writing (reflection), discussion, lecture and projects.
